**STATION 4** **Real Gold!**  
Goldrush at Rabbit Creek

In the mid 19th century California was a sparsely populated area in the USA. This changed when a construction worker was inspecting the sawmill by a river and saw a slight glittering in the water. He picked up a handful of gravel and mud, washed the mud from his hand and found something that took him completely by surprise. Gold!

The mining of precious ores – on the Krahberg-zinken, for example – transformed Schladming in the period from the 13th to the 15th centuries into one of the most important mining communities in Styria. Gold, however, has never been found – right up to the present day ...



**STATION 5** **Real Cheese!**  
Kasalm

On the alpine meadows the cows that are holidaying here produce especially good milk. And this milk is used to produce traditional Ennstal Styrian cheese. But you can sample it at home too!

**Mausi's Styrian cheese recipe:**

Add salt and pepper to 1 kg of low-fat quark and mix well. Squeeze out the fluid through a sieve. Weigh down the quark a little in the sieve and leave for 1-2 days. Place the quark onto a cloth and leave in a warm place for a few days (until cracks develop). Then lay a damp cloth over it and put it in a cool place. Turn daily for 4-6 weeks until it turns a grey-brown colour.



**STATION 6** **Real art!**  
KunstWelt

Where the woods become thinner again, the trees give way to a beautiful view of the Schladming landscape of the many mountains and valleys, including the highest mountain of Styria at 2995 m – the Dachstein.

"This is real art and nature is the greatest artist!", Hopsi says reverently to himself. He unpacks his art supplies from the backpack and starts to copy Mother Nature.
